It's a classification that can take in everything from floods and gas leaks to a flu pandemic, but it's clear that a well-organised business should have a broad plan in place should such situations occur.

LOLER in the Workplace

Accidents and fatalities involving lifting equipment in the workplace still happen. It is designed for managers and supervisors, and others with responsibilities for health and safety in the workplace.

- Effectively assess the risks associated with lifting operations and lifting equipment.

- Plan lifts systematically, taking into account key factors such as load capacity, environmental conditions, communication protocols and roles and responsibilities.
- Understanding the process required for examinations and inspections of lifting equipment to ensure compliance with LOLER regulations and identify any potential hazards or maintenance requirements.

Managing Health and Safety

The Health and Safety at Work Act was passed in 1974, and has done much to reduce instances of people experiencing ill health through their work. PUWER applies wherever the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 applies. In this lesson, we give you an introduction to the Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations 1998 (PUWER).
