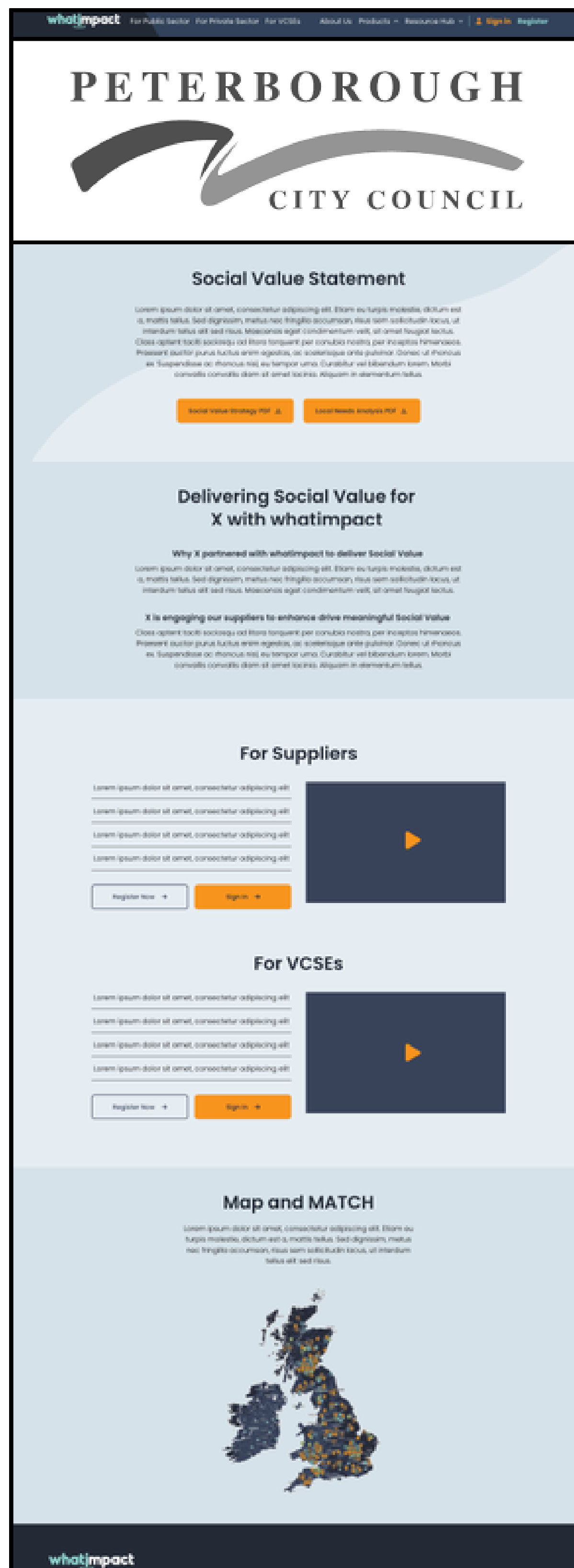

Direct Outcome 3

Our workshops highlighted the importance of urban trees and spaces in which individuals and communities can play a part in planting and protecting them. We successfully engaged many people with no prior experience in planting trees or maintaining or improving their local environment.

Key Learnings

There is real appetite in the area for the type of program (Offering to engage 10 schools was too ambitious. We had to find ways to effectively increase the number of residents consulted).

Impact

Intervention created more green space for residents
The design that delivered an increased specific value, provide a fully whole and increase its support for the community. It also created green spaces through the estate to create a more vibrant for the estate and residents to enjoy. Many residents without regular garden now have access to a green space, a healthy, active space, and a place to play.
