The Azure Pricing Calculator provides estimates based on user-defined inputs, assuming continuous 24/7, 30-day monthly usage unless otherwise specified. Key assumptions include pre-set, static pricing rates, lack of automatic scaling, and reliance on user-defined data transfer, storage, and throughput metrics. It often excludes support plans and requires manual input for Azure Hybrid Benefit.

After you configure your Azure services in the Azure pricing calculator, scroll down to the bottom of the page and use the drop-down menu to change the currency. The prices will immediately reflect the currency you select.

Please note that estimated local currency prices are calculated based on London closing spot rates that are captured in the two business days prior to the last business day of the previous month end. If the two business days prior to the end of the month fall on a bank holiday in major markets, the rate setting day is generally the day immediately preceding the two business days. This rate applies to all transactions during the upcoming month.
